DHS-Division of Rehabilitation Services (DRS) is the state agency that provides job training, job placement & post employment support services to job seekers who, due to their disability, may have difficulty with applying, preparing, interviewing, finding & maintaining successful employment. Individuals eligible for VR services are provided vocational assessment, evaluation, career guidance, training, & job placement by certified Vocational Rehabilitation Counselors. The DRS-VR Counselor's primary role is to identify and address those employment barriers preventing our customers from being successfully employed, and then provide the necessary services that will lead to a successful employment outcome or job retention. Specialized VR services are also provided for individuals who are deaf or hard of hearing, blind or visually impaired.
